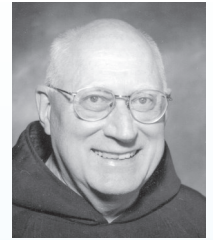

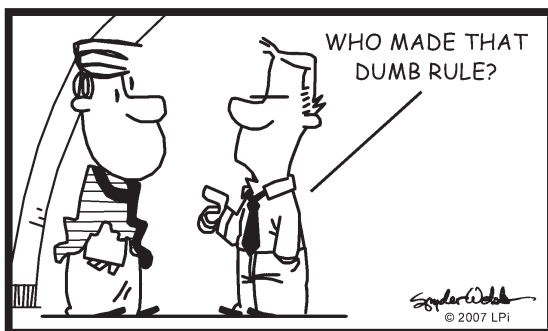

WWDWWD (why we do what we do)

For the next few months this article will appear in our weekly bulletin. It will look at what we do at Mass and, hopefully, offer an explanation. It appears at times there are people who seem very “bored” by what is going on. Perhaps understanding what we do will make it more meaningful.

Why do we sing AMEN at the end of the Eucharistic prayer? After the presider sing the doxology (Through Him, With Him, and in Him...) the entire congregation sings with one voice “AMEN”. This one word is a strong statement singing “YES, we affirm all that has been said in the Eucharistic prayer”. This implies our belief in the consecration of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ; our plea to God in behalf of the Church and the deceased; and our hope of someday being in heaven with the blessed Mother and the saints.

Why would someone not sing the AMEN? They are either not paying attention, don't agree with what the presider has said, or it's too much of an effort.
