Fr. Jim's Jottings

This weekend we celebrate one of God's greatest gifts to us....**The Body and Blood of His Son**. Last week I mentioned how the Holy Trinity is one of the divine mysteries of our faith. Well, today's feast of "**Corpus Christi**" is another mystery.

Even though we cannot explain a mystery, we embrace it because of what others have told us. In this case, we believe that the consecrated bread and wine truly are Christ's Body and Blood because He said it is so. As Catholics, our understanding of the Eucharist is unique. While Protestant churches consider the bread and wine to be a representation/symbol of Christ's Body and Blood, we believe it is truly Christ Himself. Now, that is a mystery!!!

Realizing the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist invites a profound reverence from us. We are so fortunate to believe that Christ is truly present every time we celebrate Mass. It is really and truly Jesus that we receive in Holy Communion. And Christ's presence remains as we place the consecrated hosts in the tabernacle.

I know that it takes effort to remember the sacredness of Christ's presence. Because we've celebrated Mass so often, we can take its meaning for granted. Routine can kill the spirit. May our feast today renew our awareness and appreciation for God's greatest gift to us...the Body and Blood of His Son.
