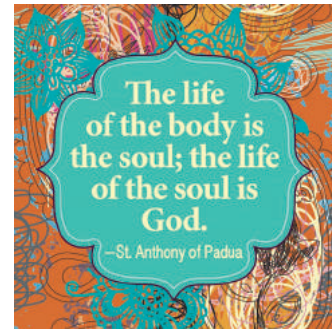
Why is GREEN the color of Ordinary Time in our liturgical year?
