St Joe's has been very generous in allowing their equipment and supplies to be placed on our parking lot. Supposedly their project will be finished by the end of July!

Flower Gardens on East Parking Lot. Thanks to our Building and Grounds volunteers these new flower gardens sure spruce up the entrance to our parish office. Along with the other flower beds on our property, St Joe's might have the most attractive property in the downtown area.
