He celebrated his first Mass at St. Joe's  
on July 31, 1904.

*Blessed Solanus" was beatified on November 18, 2017. He was only the second male American-born person to be beatified in the United States.*

*[He joined American, Father Stanley Rother in holding the title, "Blessed".]*

*His last conscious act was to sit up in bed and exclaim: "I give my soul to Jesus Christ." He died in Detroit at the age of 86 on July 31, 1957.*

The life story of Blessed Solanus is a tribute to the surprising way that God often works. This simple priest listened to and comforted thousands of people while working as the porter of St Bonaventure Monastery in Detroit, MI. He was not allowed to preach or hear confessions but for over 50 years he set an example of availability and compassion to those who were hurting.



Saints are men and women who God uses to carry on the work of His Son. For sure, Blessed Solanus did that to a heroic degree!
