Last week you asked for more info on our stained glass windows. Well, let's start by identifying each of the windows behind the reredos (that slatted wall behind the altar). The first window on the right is of **St Rose of Lima**. By this weekend her Picasso-like appearance may have changed back to her original look. If not, enjoy her unique appearance. St Rose is the first saint of the Americas. She was born in Lima, Peru in 1586 and died in 1617. Her feast day is Aug. 23. St Rose is known for both her life of severe asceticism and her care of the needy of the city through her own private efforts. I wonder why the parish decided to put her window as one of the four? Do you know?

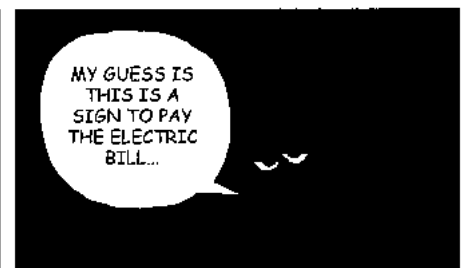
