### WWDWWD (Why We Do What We Do)

**Thanks for explaining the three stained glass windows behind the reedos in front.....namely, St Rose of Lima, Our Lady of Sorrows, and St Lawrence of Brindisi. Please tell me something about the fourth window.** Thanks for asking. The fourth window is in honor of **St Fidelis of Sigmaringen**.....another Capuchin like St Lawrence. He is known for his love of the poor. He suffered martyrdom in 1622 while in Switzerland, trying to bring the Swiss people back to unity with the Church of Rome. He was canonized by Pope Benedict XIV in 1746. The window was donated by our Third Order of St Francis here at St Joe's.

A Mass with the anointing of the sick, with Bishop David Ricken as celebrant, will be offered at 10 a.m. Monday, August 27<sup>th</sup> at St. Mary of the immaculate Conception in Greenville. This opportunity for the sacrament is made possible by the priests of the Clerical Association of Mary Mother of the Church in the Diocese of Green Bay. The anointing of the sick, according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive the sacrament has already arrived. (CCC 1514) Anyone is welcome to attend the Mass. A luncheon will follow the Mass.

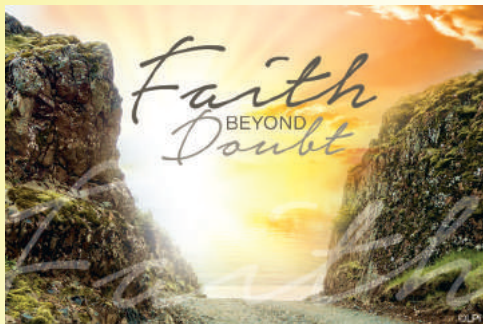
