

Br. Ray's Reflections

This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Trinity. We celebrate our God in community (Father, Son and Holy Spirit). It's a community where love is poured out from one to the other with each member giving from their fullness and then being refreshed by the love of the other. It's the Divine dance that each of us by our baptism have been invited to be part of in our daily lives. The Divine Trinity longs for us to experience this most extravagant love so that we might bring that same dance of love and compassion to the world. The mystery of the Trinity is profound, and our minds have difficulty comprehending it. What we do know is that this Trinity surrounds the world with a Divine love that heals wounds, reconciles enemies, strengthens the feeble, welcomes the stranger, stands up for the powerless and yearns for peace among all of us. May the Divine Trinity surround our broken world with love and may we all find ways to dance with the Divine!

On another note, next week we will celebrate the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi Sunday). On March 28th (Holy Thursday), Bishop Ricken promulgated a *Pastoral* Instruction for the Diocesan Practice of Holy Communion under Both Kinds.

In his pastoral Instruction, he has invited us to begin receiving the cup on the Feast of Corpus Christi (the weekend of June 1-2) but receiving under both species will not be a regular occurrence but will be reserved for Solemn Feasts. The Bishop has chosen to highlight the festive nature of a Solemnity on the liturgical calendar by offering the Precious Blood of Jesus on these days.

Fr. Bill from St. Mary's has done a wonderful job explaining the Bishop's Pastoral Instruction. Rather than re-inventing the wheel, I will include his words in the bulletin. Please don't hesitate to speak with me about the Bishop's directives. I look forward to the occasions where we will be able to share the cup with each other, again.


