Below are descriptions and photos of the three tables that were displayed at the event:

- The red table represents those community members who must make do with the most basic food groups usually high in sugar, salt, and carbs.
- The blue table represents those community members who must choose carefully to stretch their food budget, often sacrificing better nutrition in favor of cost efficiency.
- The yellow table represents those community members who are fortunate enough not to experience food insecurity. They may make choices based upon personal preference.
