

REACHING IN, REACHING OUT, REACHING GOD

Br. Ray's Reflections

This weekend we celebrate Corpus Christi, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. It is a moment to rededicate ourselves to the Eucharist. The church has been emphasizing the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist. The Church teaches that the Risen Christ is truly present in the Eucharist (Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity). We base this on scripture from the Last Supper where Christ offers the bread to his disciples and says, "this is my body," and with the cup of wine, "this is my blood." Throughout the centuries, theologians have tried to explain how Christ is truly present in the Bread and Wine. We have explained the change from ordinary bread and wine to the body and blood of Christ with the term "transubstantiation." Simply put, transubstantiation says that although the bread and wine still looks the same, they are no longer bread and wine but the body and blood of Christ. Even during the time of Jesus, people had a hard time believing this and some left Jesus because it was too hard for them to grasp. "How can he give us his flesh to eat?"

It seems to me that we either believe or doubt. If we believe in the real presence there is no explanation needed and if we doubt there is no explanation that will be enough to convince us. I am in the camp that needs little explanation. I can accept the mystery of the Eucharist because receiving Christ has been a source of my greatest support and love. In the Eucharist, Christ comes to me not as a powerful leader or Judge but in a fragile and vulnerable piece of bread and a simple cup of wine. He places himself in our hands as body broken and blood poured out. It is in this simple, ordinary meal that we meet Christ at each Mass. Because it's so familiar to us, we can miss the depths of this mystery and miss Christ. As we come to the table to receive the Eucharist this weekend, maybe we can open ourselves and be as vulnerable to Christ as Christ is to us. Then, after we receive this extravagant love, Christ sends us out to the world to allow ourselves to be broken and poured out for all our brothers and sisters. The Eucharist is not just a personal encounter with Christ but he feeds us with his very self so that we might feed the world. Let us celebrate this Feast by being the true presence of Christ to our world!!
